Travelling to Szeged

Parking information

Public Transportation

Szeged boasts an efficient public transport system comprising trams and buses. Tickets can be purchased from drivers or via vending machines located throughout the city. Important: Always validate your ticket upon boarding. Ticket inspectors frequently check for validated tickets, and fines are imposed for non-compliance.

Cultural Attractions , Free-Time and Outdoor Sport

During your stay, we encourage you to explore Szeged's rich cultural life. Visit the **Votive Church** of Szeged, a symbol of the city, and stroll through **Dóm Square**, one of Hungary's most beautiful public spaces. The **REÖK Palace** offers rotating art exhibitions in an impressive Art Nouveau setting. If the weather is pleasant, enjoy a walk or run along **Tisza River** or **Erzsébet Liget**.

Mass Times in Szeged

If you wish to attend Mass during your stay, several churches in Szeged offer regular services. The most notable is the Votive Church (Dóm) at Dóm tér, which holds daily and Sunday Masses. Discover Szeged's Museums

Szeged is home to several fascinating museums worth visiting:

- Móra Ferenc Museum: The city's main museum featuring archaeology, natural sciences, and fine art collections.
- Fekete Ház (Black House): A historic building hosting temporary exhibitions and historical interiors.
- Old Book Collection – Klebelsberg Library: Located at the University of Szeged, this rare collection of books is a treasure for literature and history enthusiasts.

Currency & Money Exchange

Hungary's official currency is the Hungarian Forint (HUF). For the best exchange rates, visit the money exchangers located on Tisza Lajos Boulevard, close to the city center.
